CIRCULAR :

A reference is invited to the Ordinances 119, 119-A and 120 relating to the minimum attendance necessary for keeping terms and condonation of deficiency in attendance **vide** this office Circulars No. UG/16 and No. UG/235 dated 14th January, 1994 and 3rd July, 1998, respectively and the Directors/Heads of the University Departments, Principals of the constituent/affiliated colleges, Heads of the constituent recognized Institutions concerned, the Director, Institute of Distance Education and the Captain Superintendent, Ministry of Surface Transport, Training ship 'Chanakya', Government of India, Nerul, Navi Mumbai – 706, are hereby informed that in exercise of the powers conferred on the Management Council under Section 54(1) of the Maharashtra Universities Act, 1994, the Management Council has amended the Ordinances 119 and 119A and amalgamated into Ordinance 119 and also amended Ordinance 120 relating to the minimum attendance necessary for keeping terms and condonation of deficiency in attendance to read as under and the same has brought into force from the academic year 1999-2000 and thereafter :-

O.119: The following shall be the minimum attendance necessary for keeping terms:-

<u>Faculty</u>	<u>First Term</u>	<u>Second Term</u>
Ayurvedic Medicine	75 per cent of the total number of lectures and practicals held in a term.	
Dentistry	75 per cent attendance of lectures, practicals, clinics, demonstrations and seminars held in the two terms taken together at each of the examinations leading to the B.D.S. and M.D.S.	
Medicine (only for First Second and Third M.B.B.S. Examinations)	75 per cent of the total number of lectures delivered and 75 per cent of the total number of practicals held during the three terms taken together.	
Arts* Science, Commerce,	For granting the terms in each subject minimum attendance of 75 % of the theory lectures, practicals & tutorials (wherever	
Law and Technology	prescribed) separately will required out of the total number of lectures, practicals and tutorials in the subject conducted in the term.	

Notwithstanding what is stated above, students participating in sports, cultural activities, N.S.S., N.C.C., Adult and Continuing Education & Extension will be permitted full credit for lectures/practicals/tutorials missed by them as a result of their participation in N.C.C./N.S.S./A.C.E.E. camps, Inter-collegiate, Inter-University, State, National and Inter-national tournaments/competitions and coaching camps /training sessions organized in participation of these tournaments/competitions. This credit should be allowed on the basis of production of certificate of participation in such authorized activity from the concerned organizers.

* For the B.S.W. and M.S.W. degree courses under the Faculty of Arts, three fourths of the lectures held for each subject in each term has been laid down.
